6. TREASURER'S REPORT

Treasurer circulated two Financial Reports: *Year-End to 31st March 2012* and *month to date – 11 April 2012 with budget for ensuing year*. Maurice highlighted and explained some items on the year-end statement. The Balance on Hand on 31 March 2012 was \$18739.56. The second statement contained budget figures for the year 1 April 2012 to 31 March 2013 and these were discussed point by point. After some discussion, it was agreed to increase the budget figure for School Food Programmes to \$5,000, allowing \$1,000 for each school in the geographical area supported by WAICC. Moved by MT/MVB that the proposed budget for the year 1 April 2012 to 31 March 2013, with an amendment under item Expenditures D - Donations to School Food Programmes increasing amount from \$4,000 to \$5,000, be approved as circulated. 8. COMMITTEE REPORTS

- 8:1 Clergy David Good Friday Walk with the Cross took a different route this year and included stops such as the school and the liquor store. Felt by those who took part to have been a good change. It was agreed that the service which followed at Wolfville Baptist Church was very lovely. The weather was clement and both events were well attended. Noted that the documentary "Occupation 101" which was shown in Greenwich in March would be well-worth re-screening. Sandra will look into this.
- 8:2 Food Bank Diana reported that statistics which are prepared by each registered food bank annually in the month of March (kindly undertaken by Mary Carter this year) showed a number of interesting things. For example, calculated number of volunteer hours for the month was in excess of 800 and there are currently 61 "signed-up" volunteers working with the Wolfville food bank. <u>Wolfville Pastoral Charge</u> – On 22nd April an important vote will be taken concerning options regarding the future of the area's United Churches. Rev. Robin Brown-Hewett has resigned effective the end of June.

It was noted that it is highly probable that St. Andrew's Church, its Hall and the Manse and possibly St. John's Parish Hall will be sold. This will create a "space" at the north end of the Seaview/Locust Avenue block. A meeting has been arranged for Sunday 15th April at 1:00 pm in St. Andrew's to discuss the possible uses for this "space". Anyone interested is urged to attend.

<u>St. Francis</u> – Parishioners have reviewed Archbishop Mancini's Pentecost letter. 50 prayer initiatives to be undertaken. There will be a special service at the Farmers' Market on Pentecost Sunday, the 27th May in the afternoon.

<u>St. John's Cornwallis</u> and <u>St. John's Horton</u> - reported that their joint Lenten Study (with St. James, Kentville), "Growing closer to God" had been a very worth-while exercise. They hope to do something similar in the months ahead.

<u>Wolfville Baptist</u> – There will be three sessions in mid-May when the report of the Steering Committee will be given followed by a discussion period. This is very important in the life of the church as they look at their way forward.
