#### 1. Welcome

President Roger Prentice extended a warm welcome to all present.

# 2. Opening Scripture and Prayer

Roger read from the Gospel of the Day, Matthew 28:15-20, which records The Great Commission—an appropriate topic for Roger to use as he begins his presidency. The theologian Douglas Hare comments that this is a clear indication that the gospel is for more than the Jews. Roger reminded us that WAICC's outreach is to help all in need both practically and educationally as we strive to cater to the well being of body, mind and spirit.

3. The Agenda was accepted as presented (RC/S D). Carried.

#### 4. Extraordinary Business

Evaluation of the Public Meeting of 21<sup>st</sup> May, 2014. Lively and extensive discussion resulted in the following points:

- 1) Ray Ivany's presentation rated at 90%; the missing 10% concerned the final connecting point for the churches to be involved and effective (e.g., churches and immigrants).
- 2) The event provided great exposure for the churches.
- 3) In retrospect some would have preferred a panel discussion instead of individual question/answer format.
- 4) How do we as church members offer hope and encouragement in an economic culture of fear?

Brainstorming continued with potentially effective suggestions. There was general agreement that the topic needs more airing. Therefore the following motion was made "that a committee be formed to create a panel to discuss the Ivany Report in order to make it effective in the life of the community" (DG/DS). Carried. Maurice Tugwell, Sharon Doyle, Penni Burrell and Roger Prentice agreed to serve on this committee.

### 5. Treasurer's Report

Copies of the current financial report, together with a few notes of explanation, were circulated. The capital account held a total of \$40,000.16. Maurice reported the situation is normal for the time of year. Motion to accept the financial report was carried (DS/PB). Maurice expressed appreciation to Diana who acts as Treasurer's Assistant when Maurice is away. They make a great team!

(a) Youth Initiative (WAY)

Penni and Andy shared details of the eight week pilot project which will soon be completed. The members of the Wolfville Area Youth Committee are Penni Burrell, Joan Boutlier, Sandra Fyfe, Andy Pitter and Annika Sangster. The WAY committee submitted a detailed report to the meeting. Copies were circulated. A report on WAY was also received from Rachel Lutz, one of the youth workers. The question of insurance and waiver support from WAICC was discussed at length. However, no firm request came to WAICC for further financial support at this stage. Penni and Andy expressed the necessity that the insurance process should be dealt with now. However, further decisions concerning the waiver support from WAICC and the future of WAY will be made in the fall. At that time the committee proposes to return to WAICC with an update report. Roger expressed appreciation to all who had volunteered to help in this project. He assured Penni of his support if questions arose through the summer.

(b) Address from Canon Russell Elliott at the September meeting- Diana reported that she had spoken with Canon Elliott, who is happy to speak to WAICC after the business meeting on September 10<sup>th</sup>. This will be a privilege for all of us.
